
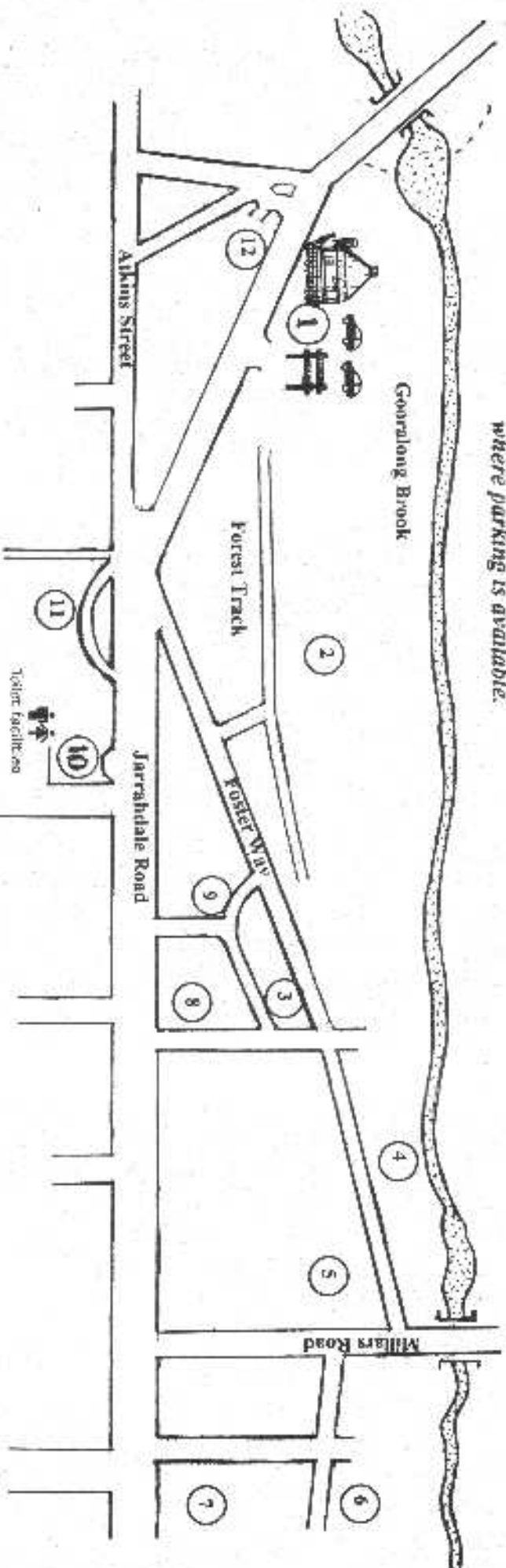


JARRAHDALE POST-FEDERATION WALK TRAIL

Walk Time - 45 mins

Trail starts at the Old Post Office Museum, where parking is available.

 Dogs allowed
- must be on leash



1. **OLD POST OFFICE**
Built as a post and telegraph office. Operational from 1896 - 1972.
2. **MILL MANAGER'S RESIDENCE**
Built for Neil McNeil in 1889, then the residence for successive mill managers.
3. **SITE OF MILL OFFICE**
Built c1913. Destroyed by fire in October 1992.
4. **MILLS (1920 & 1949)**
These were the last of the steam driven mills. Subsequently used for drying and seasoning timber.
5. **WATER TANK**
Built in the early 1950s for the houses in this area, known as "new town".
6. **SINGLE MENS' QUARTERS**
These were built in the 1960s and known as "Bachelor Row" and each consisting of only two rooms.
7. **MILL (1968)**
This mill was all electric, built in 1968. It closed down in September 1997.
8. **GENERAL STORE**
Originally the timber company store built on Foster Way. Relocated to this site in 1959.
9. **MEDICAL SITE**
Contained hospital, morgue, doctor's residence and nurses' quarters, which became a nursing post until 1972.
10. **WAR MEMORIAL**
Erected in memory of the 41 Jarrahdale men who died, from the 136 who enlisted for WW1.
11. **SQUIRRE'S SHOP**
A general store, with a PO added in 1972. Now a private house.
12. **SITE OF COMPANY "COTTAGE"**
Built 1902. New building is now Georralong Cafe.
